### **KEY HIGHLIGHTS**

### 1. September 2025 Intake

Applications for the September 2025 intake are currently open and will close on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2025.

Early admission is encouraged as it gives trainees adequate time to cover their coursework and prepare for modular assessments. Let's spread the word to prospective trainees.

### 2. Co-Curricular Highlights 2025 - Drama & KATTI Season I Games

In April 2025, our trainees represented the college at the National Drama and Film Festival in Nakuru, excelling in Play, Choral Verse, Creative Cultural Dance, and Solo Verse. Their stellar performances placed us among the top institutions nationally.

In May, the college participated in the KATTI Season I Games (Athletics and Indoor Sports) at the Regional level, with 21 advancing to represent the college at the Nationals, showcasing talent and commendable sportsmanship.

### 3. Modularization of CBET Courses

In line with the government's latest guidelines and the industry's increasing demand for hands-on skills, all CBET (Competency-Based Education and Training) courses have now been modularized. This new structure allows trainees to complete and be certified in each module per term, making training more flexible, career-driven, and time-efficient.

Our first modular cohort, which enrolled in May 2025, has now successfully completed Module I by undertaking their summative assessments. These trainees will progress to Module II in the September–December 2025 term. A new cohort will also begin Module I during this period. See Appendix I for an overview of the modular course structure.

### 4. Assessments

We congratulate all trainees who completed their assessments this term. Their hard work is highly commendable.

Given the practical nature of TVET training, the College emphasizes the need for timely payment of assessment and materials fees to ensure smooth learning and adequate preparation for practical assessments. These fees are payable during assessment registration, and parents/guardians are urged to support this effort by making the necessary payments as outlined in the college fee structure.

**Note:** A trainee can only proceed to the next module after successfully completing and clearing all assessments for the current module.

### 5. Institution Fees and Payment Information

We appreciate the parents and guardians who have paid the household contribution under the TVET funding model on time. Those with outstanding balances are advised to settle them before resumption of classes on 1st September 2025.

# Key/Notes

- Each module is equivalent to one academic term lasting three to four months.

- Industrial Training is an integral part of the course and must be completed for a trainee to successfully complete the program. Level 4 (formerly known as Artisan) comprises two modules and one industrial training.
   Level 5 (formerly known as Craft Certificate) includes four modules and one industrial training.
   Level 6 (formerly known as Diploma) comprises seven modules and two industrial trainings.
   Industrial Training is an integral nart of the contract of the contract.
