KEY HIGHLIGHTS

1. January 2026 Intake

- Applications for the January 2026 intake are currently open and will close on 30th January 2026. Our Intakes are open in Modular curriculum, Dual Training and Recognition of Prior Learning.
- Early admission is encouraged as it gives trainees adequate time to cover their coursework and prepare for modular assessments. Let's spread the word to prospective trainees.

2. Co-Curricular Highlights 2025 – Knowledge and Skills Competitions, and KATTI Season II Games – Ball Games

- In October 2025, our trainers proudly represented the college at the Regional and National Knowledge and Skills Competitions held at Wote Technical Training Institute (Makueni County) and Kenya Coast National Polytechnic (Mombasa), respectively. They excelled in various categories, including Electronics, Mechanical Engineering CAD, Bricklaying, Network System Administration, Restaurant Services, Web Technologies, and Welding.
- Earlier, in September 2025, the college participated in the KATTI Season II Regional Ball Games, fielding teams in men's and women's football, women's volleyball, and men's and women's handball—demonstrating remarkable talent, teamwork, and sportsmanship.

3. Implementation and Progress of Modularized CBET Training

In line with the government's latest guidelines and the growing industry demand for practical, hands-on skills, all CBET (Competency-Based Education and Training) courses have now been modularized. This structure enables trainees to complete and receive certification for each module per term, making training more flexible, career-focused, and time-efficient.

The first modular cohort, which enrolled in May 2025, has successfully completed Module II after undertaking their summative assessments. Level 4 trainees who joined during this intake and have completed Module II will now proceed to undertake their industrial training. The September 2025 intake trainees (Module I) have also completed their Module I summative assessments and will progress to Module II in January 2026. A new modular cohort will also begin Module I in January 2026. See Appendix I for an overview of the modular curriculum structure.

4. Assessments

- We congratulate all trainees who completed their assessments this term. Their hard work is highly commendable.
- Given the practical nature of TVET training, the College emphasizes the need for timely payment of assessment and materials fees to ensure smooth learning and adequate preparation for practical assessments. These fees are payable during assessment registration, and parents/guardians are urged to support this effort by making the necessary payments as outlined in the college fee structure.

Note: A trainee can only proceed to the next module after successfully completing and clearing all assessments for the current module.

5. Institution Fees and Payment Information

We appreciate the parents and guardians who have paid tuition and assessment fees on time. Those with outstanding balances are advised to settle them before resumption of classes on 5th January 2026.



OVERVIEW OF THE CBET MODULAR COURSE STRUCTURE



Key/Notes

- 1. Each module is equivalent to one academic term lasting three months.
- 2. Level 3 consists of one module and one industrial training.
 3. Level 4 (formerly known as Artisan) comprises two modules and one industrial training.
- 4. Level 5 (formerly known as Craft Certificate) includes four modules and one industrial training.
- Industrial Training is an integral part of the course and must be completed for a trainee to successfully complete the program. 5. Level 6 (formerly known as Diploma) comprises seven modules and two industrial trainings.
 6. Industrial Training is an integral part of the course and must be completed for a trainee to su
